To involve, develop and support indigenous strategy that would cater to the developmental needs of the rural society in realizing their true strength and transforming themselves into a developed society.

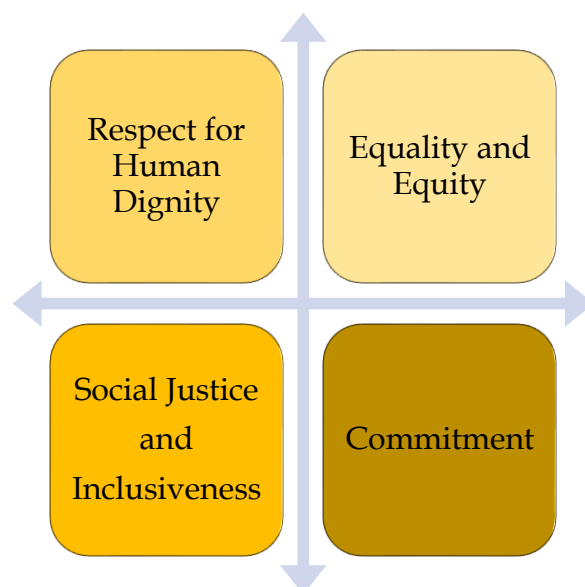


OUR OBJECTIVES & CORE VALUES

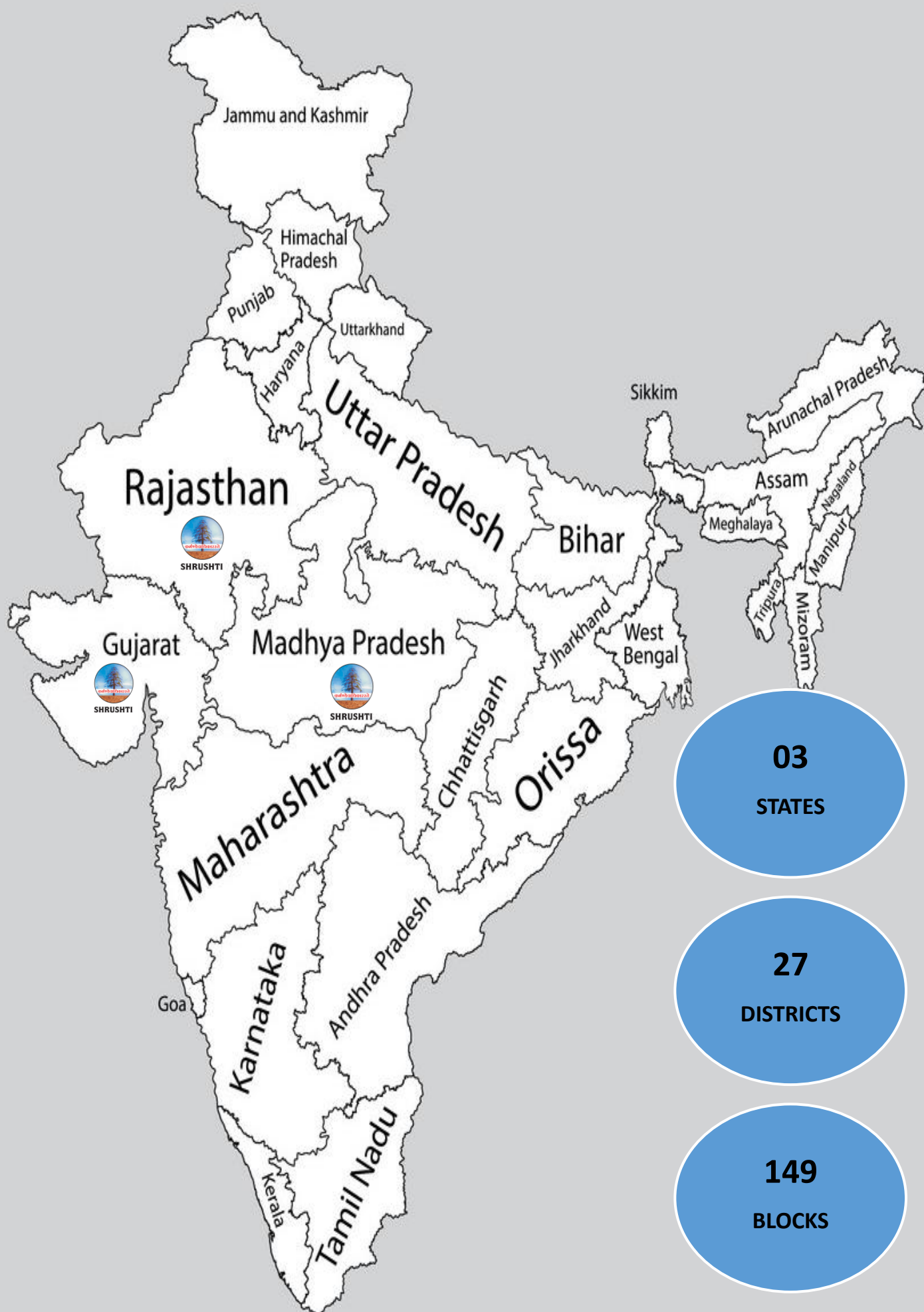
- To promote the cause of universalization of primary educational, especially girl education.

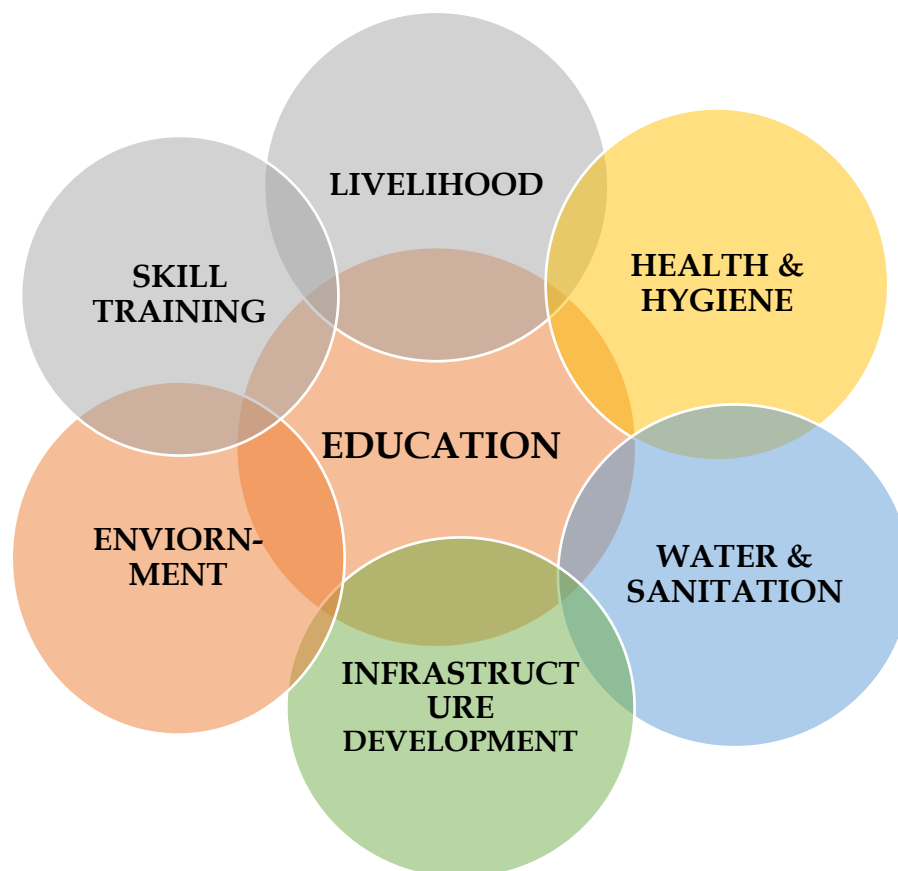

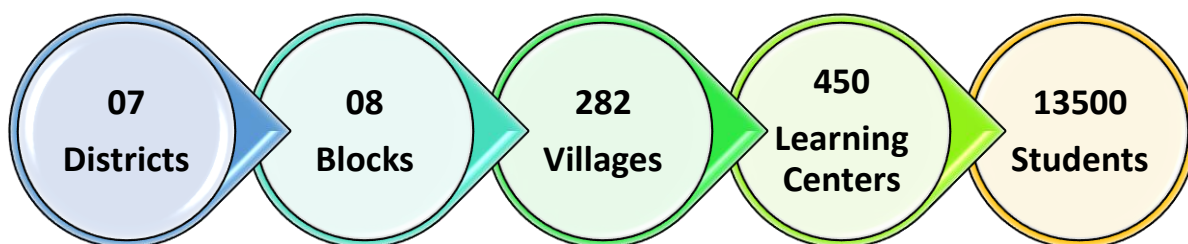

SAKHIYO KI BADI - GIRL EDUCATION PROGRAM

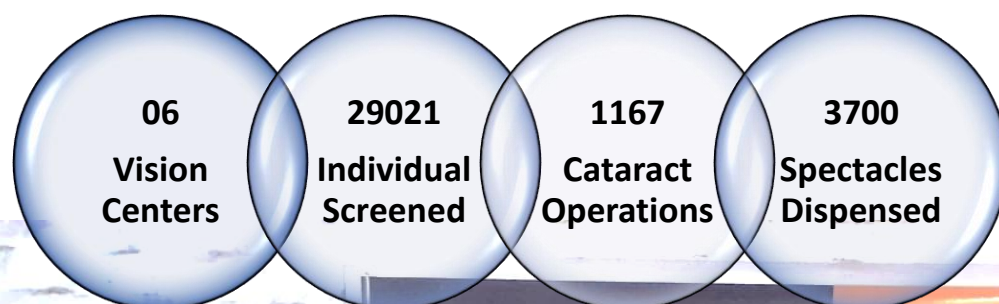


Operated in the remote tribal areas of Udaipur, Dungarpur, Pratapgarh, Chittorgarh, Sirohi, and Pali districts, the initiative propels girl child education via community schools known as 'Sakhiyo Ki Badi.' Presently, a successful network of 450 Community Learning Centers operates across 8 blocks - Kotra, Phalasiya, Sayra (Udaipur), Bali (Pali), Pindwara (Sirohi), Bicchiwada (Dungarpur), Chittorgarh (Chittorgarh) and Dhariyawad (Pratapgarh) - spanning 7 districts in Rajasthan. This model reaches around 13500 children, aiming to reintegrate dropouts or irregular students. Community schools are designed to bridge learning gaps and ease transition into mainstream education.

Across Udaipur, Dungarpur, Pratapgarh, Pali, Chittorgarh and Sirohi districts, 178 Panchayats and 282 Villages participate, catering to 13500 children. The approach encompasses both genders, emphasizing holistic development and academic excellence. Total 10,913 students mainstreamed during the period.



AMRIT DRISHTI EYE HEALTH PROGRAM

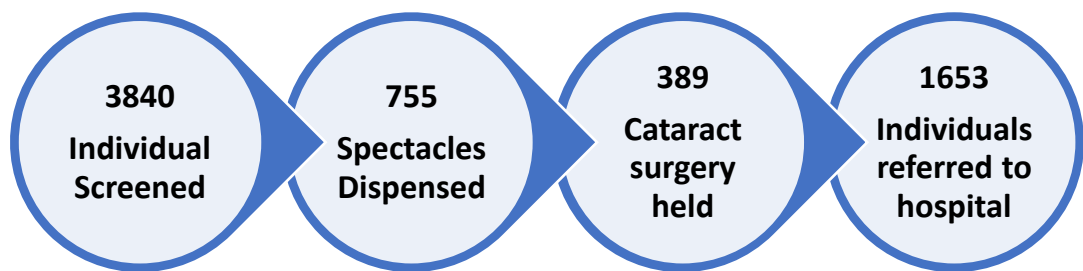


Shrushti Seva Samiti partnered with Sightsavers (Royal Commonwealth Society for the Blind, UK) to implement an eye health program targeting urban poor communities living in slums. This initiative aims to address the lack of accessible and affordable eye care services. 06 Vision Centres were established in slum areas, equipped with screening, refraction, spectacle dispensing, referral, and cataract identification facilities. Trained Optometrists and Ophthalmic Assistants provide these services.

To date, the project has screened 29,021 patients, provided spectacles to 3,700 individuals, and facilitated cataract operations for 1,167 people through affiliated hospitals. Additionally, the program emphasizes raising awareness about eye care among the slum residents, ensuring that no one goes blind due to treatable conditions like Refractive Errors (RE), Cataract, and Diabetic Retinopathy (DR).

ENSURE ACCESS TO EYE CARE SERVICE

Shrushti Seva Samiti, in collaboration with JUMIO India Pvt. Ltd., is spearheading a vital initiative aimed at providing essential eye care services to underserved communities in Jaipur. Focused on improving the ocular health of school children and individuals residing in slum areas, this project targets those from disadvantaged socioeconomic backgrounds. Over the course of a year, our mission is to reach out to approximately 4000 individuals within Jaipur's slum communities, ensuring they have access to crucial services pertaining to refractive errors and cataracts. By offering these services, we aim to alleviate the burden of vision impairment among the less privileged, empowering them to lead healthier and more productive lives.



VISION CORRECTION PROGRAM

The Eye Correction Programme conducted by Shrushti Seva Samiti, Udaipur, in collaboration with JSW Cement Ltd. Nagaur. The program was conducted over several days in February 2024, with each day dedicated to a different school. A total of 1397 students were screened for eye checkups across the 9 schools, during February 2024. The program aimed to

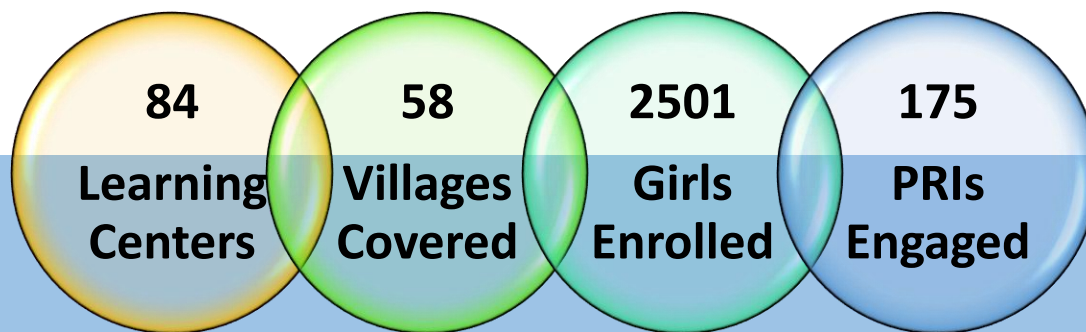
address eye health issues among students, with each school hosting the program on a designated day. The program resulted in 175 spectacles being prescribed and 50 students being referred to hospitals for further treatment, highlighting the program's impact on improving students' eye health and well-being.



IMPACT: GIRLS EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Shrushti has embarked on a significant initiative, establishing 84 community-based learning centers in the tribal-dominated Kumbhalgarh block of Rajsamand. This project reflects our commitment to enhancing educational opportunities within tribal communities, with a particular focus on girls who face unique challenges due to

high migration rates and domestic responsibilities. These learning centres offer flexible schedules, proximity to homes, dedicated local female educators, and active parental involvement. So far, the program has positively impacted over 2,501 girls, primarily from tribal backgrounds, catalysing transformation in their lives.



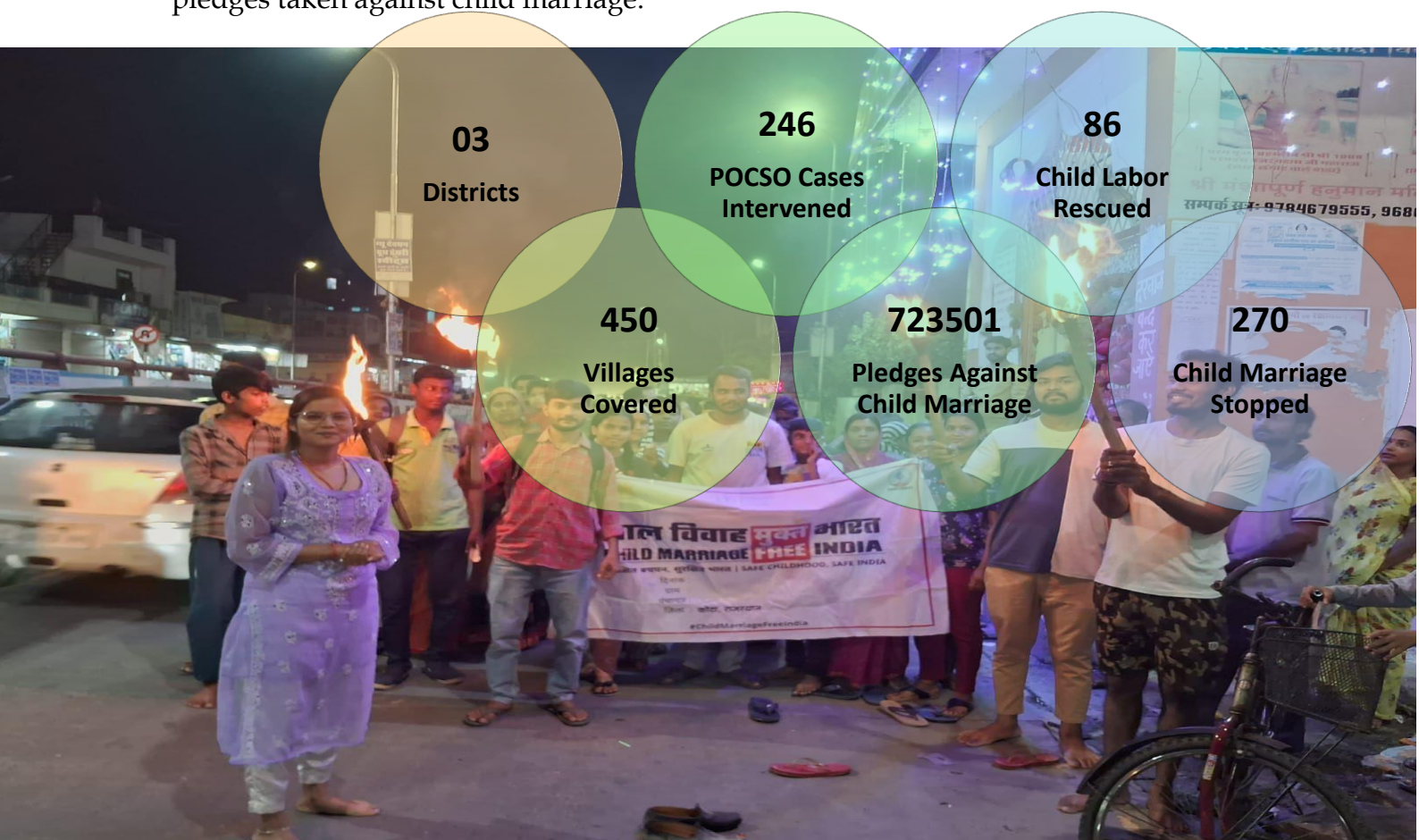
ACCESS TO JUSTICE

The 'Access to Justice' project addresses the troubling landscape of childhood in India, where pervasive violence affects millions of children, regardless of their socio-economic backgrounds. Both boys and girls face challenges such as early marriage, domestic abuse, sexual violence, bullying, and human trafficking, resulting in lasting consequences for their lives.

In collaboration with the **Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation**, this project was launched in the Dungarpur, Barmer and Kota districts to empower institutions with the capacity, accountability, and synergy needed to protect child victims of abuse and exploitation. It aims to create seamless cooperation among various child protection entities, including the State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, State Legal Services Authority, and National Legal Services Authority.

Within this program, our team offers support to children who have suffered sexual and mental abuse, providing them with both legal and emotional assistance to ensure access to justice. We also collaborate with the district's Anti Human Trafficking Unit to rescue and rehabilitate child laborers. Our mission involves securing compensation from the district administration, integrating these children into formal education, and connecting their families with state-sponsored anti-poverty and social security schemes.

Till date, in 450 villages our team has supported 246 children in cases of sexual abuse, under which in 35 cases conviction declared by the POCSO judges and compensation released to 33 victims of INR 10212500, along with it 86 children rescued from labor work, provided legal and psychological aid, 270 child marriages stopped and 723501 pledges taken against child marriage.



SUPPORTIVE SUPERVISION

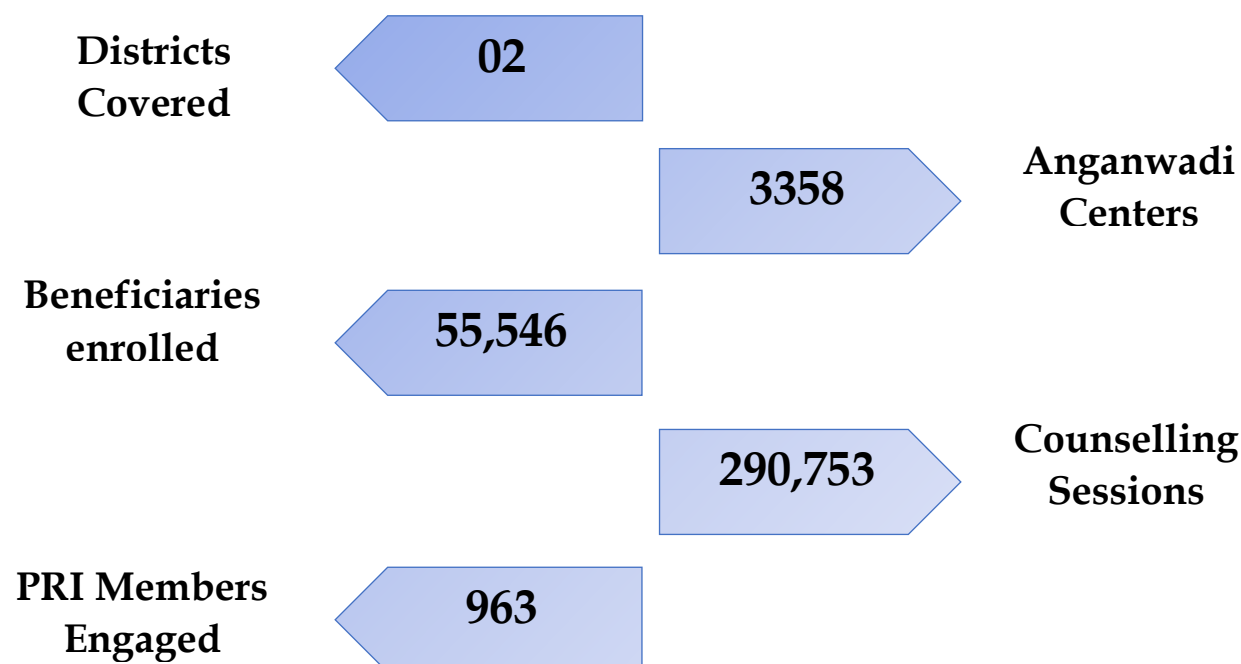
In our continuous commitment towards fostering impactful Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives, we are engaged in providing supportive supervision to Hindustan Zinc Ltd. (HZL) for their ongoing CSR projects. Our methodical approach involves engaging with diverse stakeholders, gathering essential insights, assessing feasibility, and presenting community expectations to the HZL CSR team. Additionally, our involvement extends to visiting projects funded by HZL, implemented by NGOs, obtaining beneficiary feedback, and submitting comprehensive third-party reports to HZL.

Our contribution is instrumental in creating heightened project impact and

fostering widespread visibility. The Shrushti Seva Samiti operates diligently across 174 villages of 6 locations including Debari & Zawar (Udaipur), Dariba (Rajsamand), Kayad (Ajmer), Rampura Agucha (Bhilwara), Chanderiya (Chittorgarh) with a team comprising 33 field coordinators, 5 field engineers, and 1 project consultant. Over the last four years, our efforts have been dedicated to elevating economic, social, and well-being parameters within communities surrounding HZL operations. Our approach encompasses supportive supervision, robust coordination, and fostering collaboration among partners, government entities, PRI representatives, and relevant stakeholders.



Project RajPusht



In Rajasthan, India, a troubling reality persists: one in three newborns is underweight, leading to widespread infant wasting. In response, a partnership between IPE Global and Shrushti Seva Samiti aims to bring hope to mothers and infants. Operating across 3358 Anganwadi centers in Pratapgarh and Banswara Districts, the initiative focuses on empowering pregnant and lactating women with essential cash benefits. This support enables access to nutritious food, enhancing maternal health and fostering optimal newborn development. The effort strengthens existing schemes like Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) and Indira Gandhi Matritva Poshan Yojana

(IGMPY), supplemented by a robust Social & Behavior Change Communication strategy. This holistic approach aims to cultivate a culture of consuming nutrient-rich foods among Pregnant and Lactating Women (PLWs) and children aged 6 to 24 months. Known as RajPusht, this initiative integrates financial aid, strategic programs, and community engagement to combat malnutrition and build healthier communities. In the current year, 290,763 counseling sessions have supported 55,546 enrolled women, guiding them towards improved nutrition and holistic well-being, promising a brighter future for Rajasthan's youngest citizens.



INFRASTRUCTURE FOR CLIMATE RESILIENT GROWTH PROGRAM

The Infrastructure for Climate Resilient Program (ICRG) is a crucial initiative addressing the immediate effects of climate change on daily life, especially in agriculture, where 55% of India's workforce is employed. Faced with erratic rainfall, intense downpours, and prolonged droughts, the vulnerable farming sector needs adaptation rather than just mitigation. In response, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) partnered with Shrushti Seva Samiti to implement the ICRG project in Mavli Block, Udaipur. From April 2023 to March 2024, the project spanned eight villages, 45 kilometers from the district headquarters, aiming to integrate climate-smart strategies with the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS).

The initiative focuses on building climate resilience, especially for vulnerable populations like women and girls. Key objectives include strengthening village capacities to manage and monitor MGNREGS assets, enhancing technical expertise to improve infrastructure quality, and providing evidence to guide climate-resilient livelihood policies. The project employed various strategies, including training Climate Community Managers (CCMs), building local capacity, and collaborating with government agencies to promote social security schemes. Workshops, community meetings, surveys, and environmental awareness activities were conducted, engaging district bodies, self-help groups, farmers, youth, and Panchayati Raj Institution (PRI) members for a comprehensive, sustainable approach to climate resilience.



HAR GAON ROSHAN & RATRI CHOUPAL



The "RATRI CHOUPAL" project is a transformative initiative aimed at promoting sustainable development in rural areas, particularly for women. It addresses key dimensions of economic growth, social inclusion, and environmental protection while upholding human rights and dignity. Through a collaboration between Signify and Shrushti, 105 LED street lights have been installed in 10 villages of Mavli Block and 115 solar lights have been installed in 6 villages of Kotra Block, 4 villages in Phalasiya block of Udaipur and 9 villages of Dhamottar block and 2 villages of Dhariyawad block of Pratapgarh along with providing solar bulbs to 3500 households in each village. These solar LED lights have enhanced night-time safety for women and children, and enabled children to study after dark. The project also pilots the installation of solar street lights in these villages, further improving community well-being.

The project's primary focus is to empower rural women economically, socially, and environmentally, aligning with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). It achieves this by installing solar street lights and forming women's self-help groups, adolescent girls' groups, and women farmers' groups. These groups foster economic independence and educational growth, acting as drivers of rural transformation.

IMPROVING THE SELF- RELIANCE AND RESILIENCE OF RURAL COMMUNITIES IN BANSWARA DISTRICT

Implementing The Rural Transformation BIJ (Bharat-India Jodo) program by Reliance Foundation operates in over 146 villages of Banswara District, fostering climate resilience and empowering communities to adapt to climate change. It focuses on sustainable natural resource management, increasing water supply for livelihoods and drinking purposes, and promoting climate-smart agriculture. Aligned with the National and State Action Plans for Climate Change, the program addresses vulnerabilities and develops strategies for climate action. Additionally, it supports Sustainable Development Goals 6 (water management) and 13 (climate action), offering a comprehensive approach to enhance community resilience against climate change.

RAJVIK

A project under the Rojgar Adharit Jan Kaushal Vikas Karyakram under the Mukhya Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (MMKVY) focuses on the Healthcare sector in Sikar, Rajasthan. The initiative involves managing a Skill Development Center (SDC) that provides employment-oriented healthcare training. The SDC, operating over a 6-month period, aims to enhance the employability of 60 beneficiaries by equipping them with essential, practical skills for careers in healthcare. This program offers comprehensive, job-ready training to support career development in the healthcare field.



SCIENCE AND TECH CAMP ON NATURAL RESOURCE CONSERVATION & CLIMATE RESILIENCE

The Science and Tech Camp on Natural Resource Conservation & Climate Resilience project integrates interactive and educational activities to foster environmental awareness and sustainability. It begins with sessions and activities that illustrates interdependence among living things and Management of Natural Resources, explores resource classification into natural and man-made, highlighting renewable versus non-renewable resources and the 3 R's: Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle. Biodiversity emphasizes the significance of biodiversity for ecosystem health and the consequences of its loss. Climate of India examines the country's diverse climate, shaped by geographical features and climatic patterns. Climate Change camp addresses climate change causes and effects, including air pollution, extreme heat, and disease spread, with activities such as video analysis and discussion. Under this project 5752 students from 15 Government Senior Secondary School took active part understood the process, prepared Village Development Plan and submitted to Sarpanch of the concern Gram Panchayats.

NABARD: BHEDOLI WATERSHED PROJECT

The **Capacity Building Phase (CBP) of Bhedoli Watershed** in the Chauth Ka Barwada block of Sawai Madhopur District, Rajasthan, aims to enhance watershed management through targeted capacity-building initiatives. This project focuses on reducing soil erosion, improving surface water retention, and optimizing overall physical conditions within the watershed. In addition, it addresses the

socio-economic and livelihood aspects of local communities, ensuring holistic development. By implementing Watershed Development Programme activities, the project seeks to foster sustainable environmental practices and elevate the well-being of the residents, thus contributing to the long-term resilience and productivity of the watershed area.



JUTI CLUSTER- GANGRAR

A unique partnership between Uddhyam Protsahan Sansthan and Shrushti Seva Samiti stepped into the realm of skill development, it extended a lifeline to those yearning for change. At its core, this endeavor celebrated the craft of Nagra Juti, a traditional footwear steeped in the heritage of Rajasthan and revered across the nation. The echoes of this initiative resounded profoundly, uplifting the lives of 160 artisan families.

The Uddhyam Protsahan Sansthan and the Shrushti Seva Samiti resolute determination, these young minds from Gangrar, Chittoregarh embraced the intricacies of Nagra Juti craftsmanship. By mastering this age-old art, they not only preserved tradition but also discovered a potent avenue of income.

At its essence, this partnership epitomizes the fusion of heritage,

innovation, and economic progress. It stands as a shining testament to the transformational prowess of skill development. The outcomes are tangible: lives enriched, traditions safeguarded, and resilience fortified within communities often at the crossroads of vulnerability. This empowering journey embarked upon an array of comprehensive training modules. Across one month, 100 artisans underwent skill enhancement training, followed by an intensive two-month program in Design & Technical Development for 75 artisans. Delving deeper, 75 individuals engaged in a three-month course focused on integrated design and technical mastery. Broadening horizons, an enlightening exposure and study tour to Jodhpur and Jaipur awaited 40 artisans. Equipping these talents for the future, Entrepreneurship Development Training was extended to 80 artisans.



SOCIAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT

In partnership with the Public Works Department of Churu and Hanumangarh, a pivotal social impact assessment was conducted for the Churu-Taranagar-Nohar (SH-36) road project. This assessment focuses on connecting nine routes between districts, aiming to reduce traffic congestion, improve city connectivity, and drive socio-economic growth. The study provided crucial insights into local movement patterns, laying the groundwork for socio-economic development and increasing employment opportunities. It also played a key role in the rehabilitation and resettlement process, facilitating transparent community engagement through public dialogues. This collaborative effort supports holistic development, enhanced connectivity, and improved local conditions.



VWSC TRAINING UNDER JAL JEEVAN MISSION

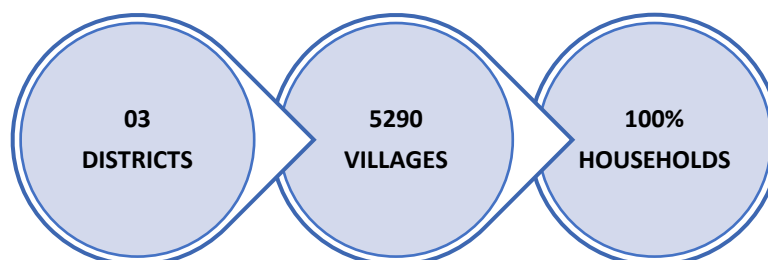
The Jal Jeevan Mission aims to provide safe drinking water to rural households via tap connections by 2024. It emphasizes community involvement and sustainability, integrating greywater management, conservation practices, and rainwater harvesting. Training sessions for Village Water and Sanitation Committees (VWSC) across Rajasthan's 07 blocks of Dungarpur District, in collaboration with local departments, empowered

7950 members to champion water conservation. This initiated in Dungarpur districts, signifies rural aspirations fulfilled. It fosters deep community understanding, promotes best practices, and cultivates a shared commitment to water sustainability. As the Mission progresses, community empowerment remains pivotal, showcasing India's journey towards universally accessible, safe drinking water.

COLLABORATION WITH THE WATER SANITATION SUPPORT ORGANIZATION (WSSO) AS ISA FOR JAL JEEVAN MISSION



Shrushti Seva Samiti has undertaken a significant role as the Implementing Support Agency (ISA) for the execution of the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) across 5290 villages in Rajasthan's Dungarpur, Udaipur, and Barmer districts. The overarching objectives of the Jal Jeevan Mission are multifaceted, aiming to usher in a "Jan Andolan" or people's movement for water, making it a collective priority.

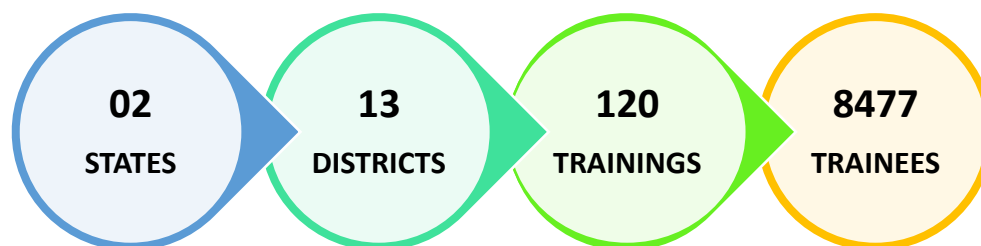
The mission entails providing Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTCs) to every rural household, with a special emphasis on areas grappling with water quality issues, drought-prone regions, and villages under the Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojana (SAGY). Moreover, the initiative aims to extend functional tap connections to essential institutions such as schools, health centers, and community buildings. Vigilant monitoring of tap connection functionality, fostering community participation through contributions, and ensuring the long-term sustainability of water supply systems are pivotal aspects.

Embracing the role of an ISA, Shrushti Seva Samiti's responsibilities encompass a comprehensive range of activities. This includes offering guidance and support to village-level bodies, mobilizing and engaging communities for effective planning and implementation, acting as a bridge between district water supply management and local governing bodies, and enhancing the capacities of PRI functionaries.

The ISA's role is far-reaching, from facilitating water campaigns initiated by the government to promoting water-related awareness, such as rainwater harvesting, water quality management, and water conservation practices.

This endeavour is rooted in the belief that water, as a fundamental resource, is everyone's responsibility. By collaborating with government bodies, mobilizing communities, and championing awareness initiatives, Shrushti Seva Samiti is contributing significantly to JJM's noble objectives of equitable and high-quality water supply for rural households.

KEY RESOURCE CENTER- JAL JEEVAN MISSION



The Shrushti Seva Samiti has been empanelled as a Key Resource Centre (KRC) by the Ministry of Jal Shakti, Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation, NJJM, New Delhi, under the National Jal Jeevan Mission. This strategic empanelment establishes the Shrushti Seva Samiti as a pivotal hub for expertise, knowledge dissemination, and resource mobilization in the pursuit of the mission's overarching goal of equitable and sustainable water supply across the nation.

As a designated Key Resource Centre, the Shrushti Seva Samiti assumes a multifaceted role that aligns directly with the mission's objectives. One of its primary mandates is to enhance awareness and comprehension of the mission's principles, strategies, and guidelines among stakeholders at various levels in the Pratapgarh & Pali districts of Rajasthan. Through

specialized training and capacity-building initiatives, the KRC empowers local communities, government officials, and field workers to effectively implement and manage water supply schemes.

Furthermore, the Shrushti Seva Samiti, in its capacity as a Key Resource Centre, is tasked with generating context-specific solutions through research, data analysis, and innovative approaches. This involves collaboration with governmental bodies, local institutions, and community representatives to develop strategies tailored to the unique water challenges faced by different regions.

By virtue of its empanelment, the Shrushti Seva Samiti serves as a critical conduit for the dissemination of best practices, technical guidance, and expertise to various stakeholders involved in the National Jal Jeevan Mission.
